1. Indian Navy invites applications from eligible candidates to apply ON-LINE through website <u>www.joinindiannavy.gov.in</u> for the post of Chargeman (Mechanic) and Chargeman (Ammunition & Explosive) classified as Group **Bq Non-Industrialq** Non-Gazetted in Pay Level - 6 at various Commands (application in other forms of mailing will not be accepted). Selected candidates would be posted to various Naval Armament Inspectorate (NAI) units at Depots/ Ordnance Factories/ DRDO labs/ Quasi Military Establishments to undertake inspection/ QA activities. The functional duties would involve sailing on-board Indian Navy platforms and handling of Explosives and Ordnance.

2. <u>Abbreviations Used</u>. UR-Unreserved, SC-Scheduled Caste, ST-Scheduled Tribes, OBC-Other Backward Class, EWS . Economically Weaker Section, ESM - Ex-Servicemen, PwBDs-Persons with Benchmark Disabilities, S-Sitting, ST-Standing, W-Walking, BN-Bending, L-Lifting, KC-Kneeling & Crouching, H-Hearing, MF-Manipulation by Fingers, RW-Reading & Writing, SE-Seeing, and C-Communication.

3. <u>Reservation</u>. Reservation for SC/ST/OBC/EWS/PwBDs categories is available as per extant Government Orders. The reserved vacancies will be filled up separately from amongst the eligible SCs, STs, OBCs, EWS & PwBDs candidates which will thus comprise of SC, ST, OBC, EWS & PwBDs who are lower in merit than the last general candidate on merit list of unreserved category but otherwise found suitable for the appointment even by relaxed standards viz. age limit etc. Reservations for PwBDs fall under the category of Horizontal reservation which cuts across vertical reservation i.e. reservation for SC/ST/OBC/ EWS (in what is called inter-locking reservation). The candidates selected against the PwBDs quota have to be placed in the appropriate category of UR / SC / ST / OBC/ EWS, as the case may be.

- 5. <u>Educational Qualifications</u>. (as per existing SRO 106/2017)
  - (a) <u>Chargeman (Mechanic)</u>. Possessing following educational qualification and experience:-

(i) Diploma in Mechanical or Electrical or Electronics or Production Engineering from a recognised University or Institute and;

(ii) Two years working experience in quality control or quality assurance or testing or proof in the area of design or production or Maintenance of Engineering equipment or system from a recognised organisation.

(b) <u>Chargeman (Ammn & Expl)</u>. Diploma in Chemical Engineering from a recognised university or institution with two years experience in quality control or quality assurance or testing or proof in the area of chemical engineering or processing from recognised organisation.

#### 6. Nature of Duties/ Job Profile.

(a) **Chargeman (Mechanic)**. Following are the generic duties and responsibilities for this post:-

(i) Provide QA/inspection cover for various Naval Armament (NA) stores under the purview of DGNAI during their design/ production/ maintenance/ storage/ disposal at various NAI units at Depots/ Ordnance Factories/ DRDO Labs/ Quasi Military Establishments.

(ii) Maintain technical records of all QA/ inspection activities undertaken during production, maintenance and preparation of NA stores.

(iii) Undertake tests utilising various facilities available in-house towards QA/ inspection of NA stores.

(iv) Assist in analysis and investigation of various defects observed during production, maintenance, preparation and exploitation of NA stores.

(v) Ensure safe custody and serviceability of gauges and equipment used for QA/ inspection.

(vi) The functional duties would involve sailing onboard Indian Navy platforms for trials & firings and handling of explosives and ordnance.

(b) **<u>Chargeman (Ammn & Expl).</u>** Following are the generic duties and responsibilities for this post:-

(i) Provide QA/inspection for Ammunition and Explosives under the purview of DGNAI during their design/ production/ maintenance/ storage/ disposal at various NAI units at Depots/ Ordnance Factories/ DRDO Labs/ Quasi Military Establishments.

(ii) Undertake visual inspection, assessment of life, re-filling, re-assembly, gauging, testing, proof firing and radiography of Ammunition and Explosive stores.

(iii) Ensure correct and strict implementation of laid down procedures as per the reference documents.

(iv) Maintain technical records of all QA/ inspection activities undertaken during production, maintenance and preparation of NA stores.

(v) Undertake tests utilising various facilities available in-house towards QA/ inspection of NA stores.

(vi) Assist in analysis and investigation of various defects/failures observed during production, maintenance, preparation and exploitation of NA stores.

(vii) Ensure safe custody and serviceability of gauges and equipment used for QA/ inspection.

(viii) The functional duties would involve sailing onboard Indian Navy platforms for trials & firings and handling of explosives and ordnance.

Note. The above list of duties is only illustrative and not exhaustive. Section/ Department of the Indian Navy may add in the list, duties ordinarily performed by personnel at this level.

(b) <u>**Crucial Dates**</u>. The Crucial date for determining the age limit and experience will be the closing date for receipt of online applications i.e **26 May 19**. Only matriculation / SSC / Birth certificate issued by concerned Education Board / Competent Authority will be considered as proof of Date of birth.

8. <u>Examination Fee</u>. Candidates (except SC/ST/PwBDs/Ex-Servicemen and Women candidates, who are exempted from payment of fee) are required to pay a fee of **Rs. 205/**-(**Rupees Two hundred and five only**) excluding applicable taxes and charges through online mode by using net banking or by using Visa/ Master/ Credit/ Debit Card. <u>Admit card will be issued for the examination only to those candidates who have successfully paid the examination fee or who are entitled to waiver of examination fee.</u>

## <u>Note</u>:

(a) Fee once paid shall not be refunded under any circumstances nor can the fee be held in reserve for any other examination or selection.

(b) In case fees has been deducted from your account without Application form being generated please wait for seven to ten working days for automatic refund of money to your account.

9. <u>Examination City</u>. The list of examination cities for different states has been indicated in the filling instructions and options for choice is made available in the application form. The candidates are to choose any three choices of cities from the list. The Indian Navy reserves the right to cancel/ re-conduct examination for a particular centre or allot/ change the city of the candidate beyond the choices indicated by the candidates for administrative or other reasons. In case of more number of candidates applying for one city, a few candidates may be allotted to any other city. Request for change of examination city/centre/date/session will not be entertained under any circumstances.

## 10. Mode of Selection.

(a) <u>Screening of Applications</u>. Indian Navy will screen all applications registered online, as per eligibility criteria and terms and conditions specified by Government of India from time to time. Merely fulfilling the basic selection criteria does not automatically entitle a person/applicant to be called for the online test.

(b) <u>Scheme of Examination</u>. All shortlisted/eligible candidates will have to appear in the online computer based examination (Discipline wise) consisting of 100 objective type questions based on syllabus as appended below:-

(d) <u>Date of Examination</u>. Exact date, time and venue of online test will be communicated to the shortlisted candidates on registered mobile phone number/e-mail ID. Websites <u>www.joinindiannavy.gov.in</u> and <u>www.indiannavy.nic.in</u> may also be referred from time-to-time for any further instructions.

(e) **Provisional Appointment Letter.** The appointment of provisionally selected candidates will be strictly based on their relative merit position in examination subject to verification of documents, Medical Examination and other requirements as specified by the Government of India and Appointing Authority.

(f) <u>Document Verification</u>. All documents pertaining to age, education, identity, address, category, caste validity certificate and work experience certificate, disability certificate etc. will be scrutinized and verified as per extant DoP&T policy. Date and Venue for document verification will be intimated to the provisionally selected candidates on their registered mobile phone/e-mail IDs and by post.

#### 12. <u>Guidelines for filling Online Application</u>.

(a) Candidates are required to apply online on the website <u>www.joinindiannavy.gov.in >></u> Join Navy >> Ways to join >> Civilians >> Chargeman (Mech) & Chargeman (Ammn & Explosive). Before filling online application form, applicants are advised to read and download How to Applyquidelines containing instructions for filling up Online Application Form.

(b) The applicant must possess the required criteria as mentioned in the advertisement.

(c) Applicants are not to send copy of application form or any document to this office. However candidates are to take a printout of Application Form for his / her personal record. A print out of the <u>ADMIT CARD IS TO BE BROUGHT TO THE VENUE FAILING WHICH THE</u> <u>CANDIDATE WILL NOT BE ALLOWED TO APPEAR FOR THE EXAMINATION.</u>

(d) If the candidates commit any mistake in filling the online application form, it cannot be corrected by Indian Navy. Indian Navy will take no responsibility of any kind for such application forms.

(e) The applicants must ensure that while filling their application form, they are providing their valid and active e-mail IDs and mobile number as Indian Navy may use either mode of

communication for contacting them at different stages of recruitment process. <u>No change in</u> <u>the e-mail ID will be allowed once entered</u>. Indian Navy will not be responsible for non-receipt of email or loss of their e-mail ID password.

(f) Candidates are requested to remember the password given by them during registration as it is important for further login.

(g) Candidates are strongly advised in their own interest to apply online well before the closing date and not to wait till the last date for depositing the fee to avoid the possibility of disconnection/ inability/ failure to log on the website on account of internet connectivity issue or website overload.

(h) Applicants should not submit multiple applications for same post. However, if due to any unavoidable circumstances, any applicant submits multiple applications then he / she must ensure that the application with higher registration number is complete in all respects, which will be considered.

(j) Candidates will be required to indicate their choice of Command for posting, in order of preference. This will have no bearing on their merit. This information will be utilized by the Indian Navy to determine the place of posting, to the extent feasible in respect of qualified candidates.

(i) Passport size colour photograph with light background (preferably white) without any obstacle covering/obstructing the face and eyes. The size of photograph should be between 20Kb and 50 Kb.

(ii) Candidate signature should be on a plain white paper with black ink. The signature should not be digitalized. It should be scanned copy of your own signature on paper with pen. The size of signature document should be between 10Kb and 20 Kb.

(iii) A copy of candidate caste/EWS Certificate, in case applying against a reserved post.

(iv) A copy of candidatec Birth Certificate/Matriculation/SSC certificate for Date of Birth.

(v) A copy of candidate **c** relevant education qualification proof.

(vi) A copy of certificate duly indicating the proof of work experience in relevant field as brought out in Para 5 above.

(vii) A copy of certificate showing disability for PwBDs and eligibility for scribe, if applicable.

(c) A candidate in whose case a certificate of eligibly is necessary may be admitted to Examination but the offer of appointment will be given only after the necessary eligibility certificate has been issued to him by the Government of India.
