- 4. This RFP is being issued with no financial commitment and the Buyer reserves the right to change or vary any part thereof at any stage. Buyer also Reserves the right to withdraw the RFP, should it become necessary at any stage.

Part I - General information

- 1. <u>Last date and time for depositing the Bids:</u> 20 Feb 19(Wednesday), at 1200 hrs. The sealed Bids (single Bid Commercial) should be deposited/reach by the due date and time. The responsibility to ensure this lies with the Bidder.
- 2. <u>Manner of depositing the Bids:</u> Sealed Bids (original ink-signed) should be either dropped in the Tender Box marked as "WESEE TENDER BOX" or sent by registered post at the address given above so as to reach by the due date and time. Late tenders will not be considered. No responsibility will be taken for postal delay or non-delivery/ non-receipt of Bid documents. Bids sent by FAX or e-mail will not be considered (unless they have been specifically called for by these modes due to urgency).
- 3. <u>Time and date for opening of Bids</u>: 20 Feb 19 (Wednesday) at 1500 Hrs. (If due to any exigency, the due date for opening of the Bids is declared a closed holiday, the Bids will be opened on the next working day at the same time or on any other day/time, as intimated by the Buyer).

7. Forwarding of Bid: Bid should be forwarded by Bidders under their original memo / letter pad inter alia furnishing details like TIN number, VAT/CST number, Bank address with EFT Account if applicable, etc and complete postal & e-mail address of their office.

- 8. Clarification regarding contents of the RFP: A prospective bidder who requires clarification regarding the contents of the bidding documents shall notify to the Buyer in writing about the clarifications sought not later than 14(fourteen) days prior to the date of opening of the Bids. Copies of the query and clarification by the purchaser will be sent to all prospective bidders who have received the bidding documents.
- 9. <u>Modification and Withdrawal of Bid</u>: A bidder May modify or withdraw his bid after submission provided that the written notice of modification or withdrawal is received by the Buyer prior to deadline prescribed for submission of bids. A withdrawal notice may be sent by fax but it should be followed by a signed confirmation copy to be sent by post and such signed confirmation should reach the purchaser not later than the deadline for submission of bids. Part III – Standard Conditions of RFP

Penalty for use of Undue influence: The Seller undertakes that he has not given, offered or promised to give, directly or indirectly, any gift, consideration, reward, commission, fees, brokerage or inducement to any person in service of the Buyer or otherwise in procuring the Contracts or forbearing to do or for having done or forborne to do any act in relation to the obtaining or execution of the present Contract or any other Contract with the Government of India for showing or forbearing to show favor or disfavor to any person in relation to the present Contract or any other Contract with the Government of India. 

The Seller agrees that if it is established at any time to the satisfaction of the Buyer that the present declaration is in any way incorrect or if at a later stage it is discovered by the Buyer that the Seller has engaged any such individual/firm, and paid or intended to pay any amount, gift, reward, fees, commission or consideration to such person, party, firm or institution, whether before or after the signing of this contract, the Seller will be liable to refund that amount to the Buyer. The Seller will also be debarred from entering into any supply Contract with the Government of India for a minimum period of five years. - 10. <u>Notices</u>: Any notice required or permitted by the contract shall be written in the English language and May be delivered personally or May be sent by FAX or registered prepaid mail/airmail, addressed to the last known address of the party to whom it is sent.
- 11. <u>Transfer and Sub-letting</u>: The Seller has no right to give, bargain, sell, assign or sublet or otherwise dispose of the Contract or any part thereof, as well as to give or to let a third party take benefit or advantage of the present Contract or any part thereof.

- 7. Fall clause. The following Fall clause will form part of the contract placed on successful Bidder:-
 - (a) The price charged for the stores supplied under the contract by the Seller shall in no event exceed the lowest prices at which the Seller sells the stores or offer to sell stores of identical description to any persons/Organization including the purchaser or any department of the Central government or any Department of state government or any statutory undertaking the central or state government as the case May be during the period till performance of all supply Orders placed during the currency of the rate contract is completed.
 - offer to sell such stores to any person/organization including the Buyer or any Department of central Govt. or any Department of the State Government or any Statutory undertaking of the Central or state Government as the case May be at a price lower than the price chargeable under the contract, they shall forthwith notify such reduction or sale or offer of sale to the Director general of Supplies & Disposals and the price payable under the contract for the stores of such reduction of sale or

offer of the sale shall stand correspondingly reduced. The above stipulation will, however, not apply to:-

- (i) Exports by the Seller.
- (ii) Sale of goods as original equipment at price lower than the prices charged for normal replacement.
- (iii) Sale of goods such as drugs which have expiry dates
- (iv) Sale of goods at lower price on or after the date of completion of sale/placement of the order of goods by the authority concerned under the existing or previous Rate Contracts as also under any previous contracts entered into with the Central or State Govt. Depts., including their undertakings excluding joint sector companies and/or private parties and bodies.
- (c) The Seller shall furnish the following certificate to the Paying Authority along with each bill for payment for supplies made against the Rate contract "We certify that there has been no reduction in sale price of the stores of description identical to the stores supplied to the Government under the contract herein and such stores have not been offered/sold by me/us to any person/organization including the purchaser or any department of Central Government or any Department of a state Government or any Statutory Undertaking of the Central or state Government as the case May be upto the date of bill/the date of completion of supplies against all supply orders placed during the currency of the Rate Contract at price lower than the price charged to the government under the contract except for quantity of stores categories under sub-clauses (a),(b) and (c) of sub-Para (ii) above details of which are given below".

8. Risk & Expense clause

- (a) Should the stores or any installment thereof not be delivered within the time or times specified in the contract documents, or if defective delivery is made in respect of the stores or any installment thereof, the Buyer shall after granting the Seller 45 days to cure the breach, be at liberty, without prejudice to the right to recover liquidated damages as a remedy for breach of contract, to declare the contract as cancelled either wholly or to the extent of such default.
- (b) Should the stores or any installment thereof not perform in accordance with the specifications / parameters provided by the SELLER during the check proof tests to be done in the Buyer's country, the BUYER shall be at liberty, without prejudice to any other remedies for breach of contract, to cancel the contract wholly or to the extent of such default.
- (c) In case of a material breach that was not remedied within 45 days, the BUYER shall, having given the right of first refusal to the SELLER be at liberty to purchase, manufacture, or procure from any other source as he thinks fit, other stores of the same or similar description to make good:-



- (ii) In the event of the contract being wholly determined the balance of the stores remaining to be delivered there under.
- (d) Any excess of the purchase price, cost of manufacturer, or value of any stores procured from any other supplier as the case May be, over the contract price appropriate to such default or balance shall be recoverable from the SELLER.

9. Force Majeure clause

- (a) Neither party shall bear responsibility for the complete or partial nonperformance of any of its obligations (except for failure to pay any sum which has become due on account of receipt of goods under the provisions of the present contract), if the non-performance results from such Force Majeure circumstances as Flood, Fire, Earth Quake and other acts of God as well as War, Military operation, blockade, Acts or Actions of State Authorities or any other circumstances beyond the parties control that have arisen after the conclusion of the present contract.
- (b) In such circumstances the time stipulated for the performance of an obligation under the present contract is extended correspondingly for the period of time of action of these circumstances and their consequences.
- (c) The party for which it becomes impossible to meet obligations under this contract due to Force Majeure conditions, is to notify in written form the other party of the beginning and cessation of the above circumstances immediately, but in any case not later than 10 (Ten) days from the moment of their beginning.
- (d) Certificate of a Chamber of Commerce (Commerce and Industry) or other competent authority or organization of the respective country shall be a sufficient proof of commencement and cessation of the above circumstances.
- (e) If the impossibility of complete or partial performance of an obligation lasts for more than 06 (six) months, either party hereto reserves the right to terminate the contract totally or partially upon giving prior written notice of 30 (thirty) days to the other party of the intention to terminate without any liability other than reimbursement on the terms provided in the agreement for the goods received.
- 10. Specification: The following Specification clause will form part of the contract placed on successful Bidder The Seller guarantees to meet the specifications as per Part-II of RFP and to incorporate the modifications to the existing design configuration to meet the specific requirement of the Buyer Services as per modifications/requirements recommended after the Maintenance Evaluation Trials. All technical literature and drawings shall be amended as the modifications by the Seller before supply to the Buyer. The Seller, in consultation with the Buyer, May carry out technical up gradation/alterations in the design, drawings and specifications due to change in manufacturing procedures, indigenization or obsolescence. This will, however, not in any way, adversely affect the end specifications of the equipment. Changes in technical details, drawings repair and maintenance techniques along with necessary tools as a result of up gradation/alterations will be provided to the Buyer free of cost within 30 days of affecting such up gradation/alterations.
- 11. OEM Certificate In case the Bidder is not the OEM, the agreement certificate with the OEM for sourcing the spares shall be mandatory. However, where OEMs do not exist, minor aggregates and spares can be sourced from authorized vendors subject to


quality certification.

- 12. Quality: The quality of the stores delivered according to the present Contract shall correspond to the technical conditions and standards valid for the deliveries of the same stores for in Seller's country or specifications enumerated as per RFP and shall also include therein modification to the stores suggested by the Buyer. Such modifications will be mutually agreed to. The Seller confirms that the stores to be supplied under this Contract shall be new i.e. not manufactured before (Year of Contract), and shall incorporate all the latest improvements and modifications thereto and spares of improved and modified equipment are backward integrated and interchangeable with same equipment supplied by the Seller in the past if any. The Seller shall supply an interchangeability certificate along with the changed part numbers wherein it should be mentioned that item would provide as much life as the original item.
- 13. <u>Quality Assurance</u>: Acceptance/ Rejection of components/ accessories on the basis of quality, lies on the sole discretion of WESEE, WB-5, RK Puram, New Delhi-66.Any ambiguities relating to the quality of product/ specific standards required, are to be clarified with this office prior to the submission of bids.
- 14. <u>Inspection Authority</u>: The Inspection will be carried out by a representative of **WESEE**, **WB-5**, **RK Puram**, **New Delhi-66**. The mode of Inspection will be Departmental Inspection / User Inspection.
- 15. **Franking clause**: The following Franking clause will form part of the contract placed on bidder:-
 - (a) Franking clause in the case of acceptance of goods/services "The fact that the goods/services have been inspected after the delivery period and passed by the Inspecting officer will not have the effect of keeping the contract alive. The goods / services are being passed without prejudice to the rights of the Buyer under the terms and conditions of the contract"
 - (b) Franking clause in the case of Rejection of goods/services "The fact that the goods /services have been inspected after the delivery period and rejected by the Inspecting officer will not bind the Buyer in any manner. The goods/services are being rejected without prejudice to the rights to the Buyer under the terms and conditions of the contract."
- 16. <u>Claims</u>: The following Claims clause will form part of the contract placed on successful Bidder
 - (a) The claims May be presented either:
 - (i) On quantity of the stores, where the quantity does not correspond to the quantity shown in the Packing List/Insufficiency in packing.
 - (ii) On quality of the stores, where quality does not correspond to the quality mentioned in the contract.
 - (b) The quantity claims for deficiency of quantity shall be presented within 45 days of completion of JRI and acceptance of goods. The quantity claim shall be submitted

to the Seller as per Form DPM-22 (Available in MoD website and can be given on request).

- (c) The quality claims for defects or deficiencies in quality noticed during the JRI shall be presented within 45 days of completion of JRI and acceptance of goods. Quality claims shall be presented for defects or deficiencies in quality noticed during warranty period earliest but not later than 45 days after expiry of the guarantee period. The quality claims shall be submitted to the Seller as per Form DPM-23 (Available in MoD website and can be given on request).
- (d) The description and quantity of the stores are to be furnished to the Seller along with concrete reasons for making the claims. Copies of all the justifying documents shall be enclosed to the presented claim. The Seller will settle the claims within 45 days from the date of the receipt of the claim at the Seller's office, subject to acceptance of the claim by the Seller. In case no response is received during this period the claim will be deemed to have been accepted.
- (e) The Seller shall collect the defective or rejected goods from the location nominated by the Buyer and deliver the repaired or replaced goods at the same location under Seller's arrangement.
- (f) Claims May also be settled by reduction of cost of goods under claim from bonds submitted by the Seller or payment of claim amount by Seller through demand draft drawn on an Indian Bank, in favor of Principal Controller/Controller of Defense Accounts concerned.
- (g) The quality claims will be raised solely by the Buyer and without any certification/countersignature by the Seller's representative stationed in India.
- 17. <u>Warranty:</u> The following Warranty will form part of the contract placed on the successful Bidder
 - Except as otherwise provided in the invitation tender, the Seller hereby declares that the goods, stores articles sold/supplied to the Buyer under this contract shall be of the best quality and workmanship and new in all respects and shall be strictly in accordance with the specification and particulars contained/mentioned in contract. The Seller hereby guarantees that the said goods/stores/articles would continue to conform to the description and quality aforesaid for a minimum warranty/Comprehensive AMC period of Three years for Rugged fanless chassis, minimum One year for MIL-STD-1553 Cards and minimum One year for remaining items from the date of delivery of the said goods stores/articles to the Buyer, if during the aforesaid period the said goods/stores/articles be discovered not to conform to the description and quality aforesaid not giving satisfactory performance or have deteriorated, and the decision of the Buyer in that behalf shall be final and binding on the Seller and the Buyer shall be entitled to call upon the Seller to rectify the goods/stores/articles or such portion thereof as is found to be defective by the Buyer within a reasonable period, or such specified period as May be allowed by the Buyer in his discretion on application made thereof by the Seller, and in such an event the above period shall apply to the goods/stores/articles rectified from the date of rectification mentioned in warranty thereof, otherwise the Seller shall pay to the Buyer such compensation as May arise by reason of the breach of the warranty therein contained.

- (b) Guarantee that they will supply spare parts, if and when required on agreed basis for an agreed price. The agreed basis could be and including but without any limitation an agreed discount on the published catalogue or an agreed percentage of profit on the landed cost.
- (c) Warranty to the effect that before going out of production for the spare parts they will give adequate advance notice to the Buyer of the equipment so that the latter May undertake the balance of the lifetime requirements.
- (d) Warranty to the affect that they will make available the blue prints of drawings of the spares if and when required in connection with the main equipment.
- 18. <u>Comprehensive Annual Maintenance Contract (AMC) Clause.</u> The following AMC clause will form part of the contract placed on successful Bidder -
 - (a) The Seller would provide comprehensive AMC for a period of **03 years**. The AMC services should cover the repair and maintenance of all the equipment and systems purchased under the present Contract. The Buyer Furnished Equipment which is not covered under the purview of the AMC should be separately listed by the Seller. The AMC services would be provided in two distinct ways:
 - i. Preventive Maintenance Service: The Seller will provide a minimum of four Preventive Maintenance Service visits during a year to the operating base to carry out functional check -ups and minor adjustments/ tuning as may be required.
 - ii. Breakdown maintenance Service: In case of any breakdown of the equipment/system, on receiving a call from the Buyer, the Seller is to provide maintenance service to make the equipment/system
 - (b) Response time: The response time of the Seller should not exceed **72 hours** from the time the breakdown intimation is provided by the Buyer.
 - (c) Serviceability of 84% per year is to be ensured. This amounts to total maximum downtime of 60 days per year. Also unserviceability should not exceed 30 days at one time. Required spares to attain this serviceability may be stored at site by the Seller at his own cost. Total down time would be calculated at the end of the year. If downtime exceeds permitted downtime, LD would be applicable for the delayed period.



(e) Technical Documentation: All necessary changes in the documentation of (Technical and Operators manual) for changes carried out on hardware and software of the equipment will be provided.

- (f) During the AMC period, the Seller shall carry out all necessary servicing/repairs to the equipment/system under AMC at the current location of the equipment/system. Prior permission of the Buyer would be required in case certain components/sub systems are to be shifted out of location. On such occasions, before taking over the goods or components, the Seller will give suitable bank guarantee to the Buyer to cover the estimated current value of item being taken.
- (g) The Buyer reserves its right to terminate the maintenance contract at any time without assigning any reason after giving a notice of 02 months. The Seller will not be entitled to claim any compensation against such termination. However, while terminating the contract, if any payment is due to the Seller for maintenance services already performed in terms of the contract, the same would be paid to it as per the contract terms.
- 19. **Product Support**: The following Product Support clause will form part of the contract placed on successful Bidder:-
 - (a) The Seller agrees to provide Product Support for the stores, assemblies/sub-assemblies, fitment items and consumables, Special Maintenance Tool (SMT)/Special Test Equipments (STE) subcontracted from other agencies/manufacturer by the Seller for a minimum period of ten years including the agreed warranty period after the delivery of equipment.
 - (b) In the event of any obsolescence during the above mentioned period of product support in respect of any component or sub-system, mutual consultation between the Seller and Buyer will be undertaken to arrive at an acceptable solution including additional cost, if any.
 - (c) Any improvement/modification/upgradation being undertaken by Seller or their sub suppliers on the stores/equipment being purchased under the Contract will be communicated by the Seller to the Buyer and, if required by the Buyer, these will be carried out by the Seller at Buyer's cost.
- 20. <u>Technical Documentation</u>: All necessary documentation (Technical and User manual) for using the product has to be provided by the bidder.



Part V – Evaluation Criteria & Price Bid issues

- 1. <u>Evaluation Criteria</u>: The broad guidelines for evaluation of Bid will be as follows:
 - (a) Only those Bid will be evaluated which is found to be fulfilling all the eligibility and qualifying requirements of the RFP technically and commercially.
 - (b) The Lowest Bid will be decided upon the lowest price quoted by the particular Bidder as per the Price Format given at Para 2 below. The consideration of taxes and duties in evaluation process will be as follows:
 - (i) In cases where only indigenous Bidders are competing, all taxes and duties (including those for which exemption certificates are issued) quoted by the Bidders will be considered. The ultimate cost to the Buyer would be the deciding factor for ranking of Bid.
 - (ii) In cases where both foreign and indigenous Bidders are competing, following criteria would be followed
 - (aa) In case of foreign Bidders, the basic cost (CIF) quoted by them would be the basis for the purpose of comparison of various tenders.
 - (ab) In case of indigenous Bidders, excise duty on fully formed equipment would be offloaded.
 - (iii) Sales tax and other local levies, i.e. octroi, entry tax etc would be ignored in case of indigenous Bidders.
 - The Bidders are required to spell out the rates of Customs duty, Excise duty, VAT, Service Tax, etc in unambiguous terms; otherwise their offers will be loaded with the maximum rates of duties and taxes for the purpose of comparison of prices. If reimbursement of Customs duty / Excise Duty / VAT is intended as extra, over the quoted prices, the Bidder must specifically say so. In the absence of any such stipulation it will be presumed that the prices quoted are firm and final and no claim on account of such duties will be entrained after the opening of tenders. If a Bidder chooses to quote a price inclusive of any duty and does not confirm inclusive of such duty so included is firm and final, he should clearly indicate the rate of such duty and quantum of excise duty included in the price. Failure to do so May result in ignoring of such offers summarily. If a Bidder is exempted from payment of Customs duty / Excise Duty / VAT duty upto any value of supplies from them, they should clearly state that no excise duty will be charged by them up to the limit of exemption which they May have. If any concession is available in regard to rate/quantum of Customs duty / Excise Duty / VAT, it should be brought out clearly. Stipulations like, excise duty was presently not applicable but the same will be charged if it becomes leviable later on. will not be accepted unless in such cases it is clearly stated by a Bidder that excise duty will not be charged by him even if the same becomes applicable later on. In respect of the Bidders who fail to comply with this requirement, their quoted prices shall be loaded with the quantum of excise duty which is normally applicable on the item in question for the purpose of comparing their prices with other Bidders. The same logic applies to Customs duty and VAT also.

- (d) In import cases, all the foreign quotes will be brought to a common denomination in Indian Rupees by adopting the exchange rate as BC Selling rate of the State Bank of India on the date of the opening of Price Bid.
- (e) If there is a discrepancy between the unit price and the total price that is obtained by multiplying the unit price and quantity, the unit price will prevail and the total price will be corrected. If there is a discrepancy between words and figures, the amount in words will prevail for calculation of price.
- (f) The L1 would be decided based on overall total price. The Lowest Acceptable Bid will be considered further for placement of contract / Supply Order after complete clarification and price negotiations as decided by the Buyer. The bidder is required to quote for all the items listed in RFP. Partial quotes are not acceptable and would be disqualified.
- (g) Any other criteria as applicable to suit a particular case.


